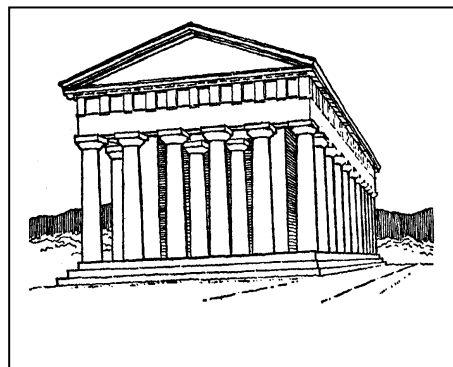


Science -
